General Phase Terms

APS average points scored by pupil in an assessment or examination

EAL English as an additional language pupils.

EYFS Early Years Foundation Stage-This is the framework for how Ofsted judge and assess working with children from birth to 5 years of age.

FSM pupils eligible for Free School Meals

KS1 Key Stage 1-This is the first part of primary education and assessment in this area currently includes Phonics screening in Year 1 and assessment of English (reading, grammar, punctuation and spelling) and maths at the end of Year 2.

KS2 (Key Stage 2) This is the summative end of primary phase national testing of English (reading, grammar, punctuation and spelling) and maths at the end of Year 6.

KS3 (Key Stage 3) This is not formally assessed or tested but covers the first 3 years of secondary phase education (Years 7-9) and Ofsted expect the full national curriculum subjects to be taught to all children in state schools under their new framework for 3 years.

KS4 (Key Stage 4) most schools take 2 years to do GCSE/Level 2 qualifications at the end of Year 11.

KS5 (Key Stage 5) In much of the country secondary phase is dominated by 11-16 schools. We have 16 schools with post-16 provision which is dominated by A Level subjects but with some vocational and other Level 3 provision.

PP Pupil Premium. Additional funding for economic disadvantage/experience of care

EYFS

The DfE monitors each LA on how many children have a Good Level of Development (GLD) by the time they start school.

This is achieved where a child meets *at least* the expected level in:

- All the Early Learning Goals (ELGs) in the Prime Areas of Learning (Personal, Social and Emotional Development; Physical Development; and Communication and Language)
- All the ELGs in the Specific Areas of Learning for Literacy and Mathematics.

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This is a total of 12 ELGs. The Government believes a good foundation in these areas is crucial for later success.

Progress 8 Progress across 8 subjects, including English (double-weighted), Maths (double-weighted), 3 English Baccalaureate qualifications and 3 other qualifications which can include English Baccalaureate subjects and other high value academic, arts and vocational qualifications from the DfE approved list¹. It measures the progress pupils make between KS2 and KS4

Attainment 8 Attainment across 8 subjects in Progress 8 but unweighted for disadvantaged. Raw scores without appeals.²

EBacc English, Maths, Science (Double) plus History or Geography and a language GCSE.

Basics Achievement of Grade 5+ in English and Maths at GCSE.
