The Prevention of Crime and Disorder: This area of Charminster has a Public Space Protection Order to deter people from drinking in the street and anti-social, the pavement is regularly having to be cleared of the rubbish left by people leaving the establishments in the area including drug paraphernalia, We have monthly meetings with the police along with the council's asb team because of the ASB etc and are slowly winning, if this extra license is granted it will have a huge negative impact on the work we are doing.
The Prevention of Public Nuisance: This property abuts a residential area and we already have regular complaints about the noise, urinating and drug use from people leaving the establishments on Charminster Road, we are working with the police to cut down on Street drinking and associated ASB this license if given will make this situation worse, particularly with the hours requested
Public Safety: Residents are concerned about the rowdiness, drunkenness and general ASB and there is a perception that the streets off/around Charminster Road aren't safe at night when the clubs turn out.
The Protection of Children from Harm: This establishment is on a corner of a residential street with young families, due to the nature of the geography noise echoes down the side roads this noise is keeping children awake, particularly as people disperse from the clubs. This is a residential area not the town Centre and should be treated as such.
