Executive summary	Mrs Julia Palmer of JCP Law has made an application on behalf of Aruba Limited for a new premises licence at Sunset Beach at Aruba, Pier Approach, Bournemouth.
	The application is to permit Plays, Films, Live Music, Recorded Music, Performance of Dance and Supply of Alcohol (On & Off) Monday to Sunday 10:00 to 23:00 and Late Night Refreshment Monday to Sunday 23:00 to 05:00.
	The licence is for a limited period from 1 April 2023 to 30 September 2028 and shall only operate during the period of 1 <sup>st</sup> of April and 30 <sup>th</sup> of September each year.
	The Licensing Authority has received one representation from Dorset Police on the prevention of crime and disorder licensing objective.
Recommendations	It is RECOMMENDED that:
	a) Grant the application for a premises licence as made;
	b) Refuse the application for a premises licence;
	<ul> <li>c) Grant the premises licence subject to additional conditions.</li> </ul>

### **Background**

 An application for a new premises licence under Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 was made on 1<sup>st</sup> of December 2022. The application is to permit the following activities at Sunset Beach on Pier Approach, Bournemouth: -

Plays - Monday to Sunday 10:00 to 23:00

Films - Monday to Sunday 10:00 to 23:00

Live Music - Monday to Sunday 10:00 to 23:00

Recorded Music - Monday to Sunday 10:00 to 23:00

Performances of Dance - Monday to Sunday 10:00 to 23:00

Late Night Refreshment - Monday to Sunday 23:00 to 05:00

Supply of Alcohol (On & Off) - Monday to Sunday 10:00 to 23:00

- 2. The licence is for a limited period from 1 April 2023 to 30 September 2028 and the premises shall only operate during the summer months, between 1<sup>st</sup> of April to 30<sup>th</sup> of September. A copy of the application, proposed conditions, site layout and photos of the area are attached at Appendix 1.
- 3. The site already benefits from a premises licence held in the name of Bournemouth Christchurch Poole Council which permits the same activities as applied for by the applicant, however, off sales of alcohol are not permitted. A copy of this licence is attached at Appendix 2.
- 4. Should this application be granted it is proposed that the current licence, referred to at appendix 2, shall be left in abeyance.

#### Consultation

- The application has been served on all responsible authorities and the applicant confirmed that the statutory notices were displayed on site and published in the local newspaper.
- 6. The application prompted a representation from Dorset Police on the grounds that granting the application would undermine the prevention of crime and disorder licensing objective. Copy of the representation is attached at Appendix 3.
