Executive summary	This short item provides information on the work carried out by Children's Services and the Corporate Finance team regarding BCP's invitation to join the Safety Valve Programme from the Department for Education.
	During October 2023, Officers have been working to identify a proposal which would see the in year High Needs Block Budget for children and young people with Special Education Needs and Disability to be balanced within a 5-year period.
	Despite significant efforts the Local Authority has been unable to provide a proposal which balances the budget within the 5-year time period set down by the Safety Valve Agreement framework.
	A proposal has been submitted to the Department for Education as detailed within. The Local Authority will be informed of the outcome during January 2024.

Background

- 1. This item provides information on the proposal which has been made to the Department for Education in December following the request to join the DfE's Safety Valve Programme.
- 2. Provided for this item are two documents which explain the proposal and the potential implications for this area of work.
- 3. Appendix 1 is the DSG management plan that was presented to school's forum on 13 December. This paper references 2 scenarios, the first provides a financial model which balances in year by year 5 as per requirements of the SV agreement however this will not provide a good service and the assumptions used have been agreed as unrealistic, including by the DfE SEND advisor supporting the safety valve programme. The second scenario is based on very challenging assumptions but is potentially deliverable, but this does not balance the DSG within 5 years with the inyear gap maintained around the current level of £27.5 million.
- 4. Appendix 2 is the 15-year SV submission that was submitted to the DfE on 15 December. The financial model is based on scenario 2 with further assumptions to reach a year 5 in year gap of £23 million.
- 5. Following a decision by the Department for Education in January, a further programme of work will take place to either implement the proposal or make alternative plans based on the advice and findings by the Department for Education.
