#### Public Safety

Following a serious incident of assault, which occurred in May 2023, the staff at this premises failed to support and ensure the welfare of the victim and instead took steps to remove the victim from the premises.

#### Protection of Children from Harm

A 'Test Purchase' exercise recently took place at the premises, led by Police, and the staff at this premises failed in their duty to promote the licensing objective to protect children from harm and failed to adhere to existing conditions attached to the premises licence when they served restricted alcohol products to minors.

This is the second occasion that Dorset Police has applied to Review this premises within the past 2 years. Dorset Police no longer has any confidence in the Premises Licence Holder /DPS to uphold the licensing objectives.

# **Please provide as much information as possible to support the application** (please read guidance note 3)

This application for a review of the premises licence for Bargain Convenience Store, also known as *Bargain Booze*, 495 Wimborne Road, Bournemouth, is being submitted by Dorset Police as we can evidence that this premises undermined the licensing objective of the ensuring Public Safety and Protecting Children from Harm.

It is and always has been the intention of Dorset Police Drug & Alcohol Harm Reduction Team to engage and support licensees throughout Dorset to promote the four licensing objectives of Preventing Crime & Disorder, Preventing Public Nuisance, Promoting Public Safety and Protecting Children from Harm.

It is our expectation that all licensees will endeavour to meet these objectives and fulfil their duty as licensees with responsibilities to uphold these objectives and meet the conditions of their premises licence.

Dorset Police have identified that this premises have fundamentally failed in the objective to prevent crime & disorder through failing to meet the safeguarding needs of a victim of serious assault and providing alcohol for consumption to minors during a Police-led 'Test Purchase' exercise.

Ensuring the safety of victims of crime, particularly where serious assaults have occurred, is expected of staff operating within licensed premises. It is understandable that some members of staff may be shocked or may lack adequate medical training, however, the staff were negligent in their response to this incident, which placed the victim at additional, avoidable, risk.

Dorset Police conducted 'Test Purchase' exercises throughout Bournemouth during October 2023 to ensure that premises were promoting 'Challenge 25' schemes (or similar) and adhering to the conditions of their premises licence where there is a requirement to verify the age of the customer to ensure that they are 18 years or older. One exercise took place at this premises and the staff sold an alcoholic product to a person under the age of 18 without any challenge or a requirement to produce identification.

Both above matters of concern have highlighted serious shortfalls in the general approach of the premise's operator towards safeguarding, particularly for those at greatest risk of harm, namely victims of crime and children. This Application for Review follows a previous Application for Review which led to the revocation of the Premises Licence. The Premises Licence was later reinstated, with additional conditions and reassurances, following a Consent Order between BCP Council and the Licence Holder.

Dorset Police invite the Sub-Committee to consider all of the options available to them under the Licensing Act 2003 with particular consideration to be given to revocation of the Premises Licence as we do not consider at this time that the other options available to the Sub-Committee would sufficiently meet the intentions of Licensing Act 2003 Section 182 Guidance given that the licence holder has willingly, and knowingly, failed to appreciate the risk presented to the victim of crime and towards children who are more likely to suffer negative health and other effects from the consumption of alcohol.

Whilst fiscal matters are not of concern to the Sub-Committee; in the event that the Licensing Sub-Committee were to revoke the premises licence, Dorset Police are of the view that the *Bargain Booze* business will remain viable given that the community is made up of residential and commercial premises that will continue to need groceries.

Dorset Police invite the members of the Licensing Sub-Committee to take this opportunity to stand alongside Dorset Police in taking a proportionate but effective approach to tackling licensed premises that fail to meet the welfare and safeguarding needs of our communities.

Dorset Police have previously applied for a Review of this premises on the grounds that they were discovered to be offering illicit tobacco for sale. A variety of illicit goods were seized by colleagues from HM Revenue & Customs.

Following the Sub-Committee Hearing, the Premises Licence was revoked, however, later reinstated prior to an Appeal Hearing following agreement between BCP Council and the Premises Licence Holder in the form of a Consent Order.
