

Report subject	Update on joint working in Health and Integrated Neighbourhood and Community Teams Programme

Executive summary	<p>This presentation provides an update to the Health and Wellbeing Board on the development of the federated model between Dorset Healthcare University NHS FT (DHC) and Dorset County Hospital NHS FT (DCH). Additionally, it provides an update on the Integrated Neighbourhood Teams Transformation Programme.</p> <p>The federated model is the form by which the joint working between DHC and DCH is described and formed. Each NHS Trust retains its identity and each Trust Board remains sovereign, whilst the Trusts collaborate by default and do things once where it is appropriate to do so. Joint Sub-Committees are being formed, supported by a Joint Executive Team and other joint roles. A Joint Strategy is being finalised.</p> <p>The Integrated Neighbourhood Teams Transformation programme is a priority programme for the Dorset Integrated Care System. It is co-sponsored by DHC and the GP Alliance with a commitment to working alongside key partners, particularly Local Authorities, and a connection to the Health and Wellbeing Board. The programme aims to bring together multi-disciplinary practitioners from across health and care organisations to deliver services to meet the needs of their defined population by focussing on personalised care that is as far as possible anticipatory rather than reactive. The INT Programme is <i>part of</i> the wider 'Place' work, however, it is not the vehicle to deliver the whole 'Place' agenda or to undertake work to address the wider social determinants of health.</p>
