Subject: Application for the Renewal of Sex Establishment License – Easy Tiger

I am writing to formally introduce myself and my business, White Tiger Europe Limited trading as Easy Tiger, in anticipation of the upcoming hearing for the approval of our sex establishment license. Our establishment, located at 27 The Triangle BH2 5SE, is designed to provide a safe, professional, and legally compliant venue for adult retail.

I am committed to ensuring that our business operates with the highest standards of integrity and respect for the community. Our establishment will strictly adhere to all relevant laws and regulations, including health and safety standards, zoning requirements, and operational guidelines.

I sold my chain of sex shops in 2019 but retained ownership of Easy Tiger in Bournemouth due to the significant community support and the value it provides to both local residents and visitors. Easy Tiger has become known for its friendly, warm, and welcoming shopping experience, attracting customers from beyond the local area. This community appreciation was evident during the initial licensing process in 2009 and continues to be reflected in the overwhelming support for our current renewal, despite receiving our **first-ever objection**.

We have always implemented a robust plan to ensure the security and well-being of our patrons, staff, and the surrounding neighbourhood. This includes comprehensive staff training, stringent age verification processes, and regular consultations with local law enforcement and community representatives. Furthermore, we are committed to fostering a positive relationship with our neighbours and addressing any concerns they may have promptly and effectively.

During the hearing, I look forward to discussing our application in detail and addressing any questions or concerns the committee may have. We believe that Easy Tiger is a valuable addition to the local economy, providing employment opportunities and contributing to the vibrancy of the community.

Because I appreciate the time and costs that occur to the taxpayer for a license hearing I will address in advance points that have not been addressed in the mediation between myself and the objector.

1. Window displays. The Local Government Miscellaneous Act 1982 (as amended) is a very outdated Act that was set up when Sex Shops only sold pornographic material. The need for blacked out windows was needed to stop people seeing pornographic material. Today pornographic material like magazines and DVDs are nearly phased out and in the next 2 years I doubt we will stock these items.

In 2016 I purchased a shop in Salisbury that had been trading with a window display for over 20 years. I refurbished this store and in 2017 my store supported and sponsored Salisbury's first ever pride. Our window display was dedicated to the pride event and

tastefully advertised the event with rainbow point of sale material and a giant pride poster.

Someone objected to the council about this advertising as it was on a school route and the council made the shop black out the windows due to the complaint. I agreed to remove the Pride window display but the council officer decided that I was not allowed to advertise anything from that moment forward and I had to black out the windows which made the shop look seedy and dated.

I appealed the decision and went to Swindon Magistrate and County Court.

The District Judge heard the appeal and advised the council to mediate with me due to the potential costs that the council would incur if they did not mediate.

The judges points were:

- Although someone may find offence to a window display, in this case a gay pride event advertised, the council should use common sense enforcing the Local Government Miscellaneous Act 1982 (as amended). In this case the enforcement of the Act to black out the windows because one person was offended.
- The council should not put in place restrictions on a business that were already covered by laws. Laws that if I broke I would end up with police involvement and a criminal record. The local authority couldn't simply presume that I would break the law especially as my livelihood depended on me respecting such Laws.
- If products are also found elsewhere on the high street without restriction, advantage shouldn't be given to retail competitors by the authority, as such restriction of enterprise constitutes an act of unfair competition.

I was happy to mediate with the council and after 10 minutes of discussions with the council and their legal advisors I was allowed window displays.

In 2024, I received one complaint, which is my only complaint to date. It concerned the wording on a boxed product that was part of a point of sale (POS) advertising campaign distributed to all retailers, including Superdrug, and also sold in public toilet vending machines. Upon receiving the complaint from the licensing officer, I promptly removed the products. Although clarification later allowed them to be displayed with minor modifications, I have chosen to keep them out of the window display.

The objections raised by the objectors regarding the 'Microphone' window displays pertain to massagers and massage guns. It's important to clarify that we sell these products as part of promoting sensuality in any relationship. Massaging, in this context, is not inherently sexual. Please find attached pictures showing what the objector refers to as 'Microphones.'



Our other window display of massagers was for the brand Theragun massager ('Microphone') which is also sold in John Lewis.



These items are clearly not designed for insertion and are not intended for sexual use

The objectors' imagination is unconstrained by reality

2. The Shop Location and customers.

The objectors' simplistic views on the shop's customers as dirty old drunks are nonsensical. The letters supporting the shop's license renewal demonstrate a diverse representation from the community, including many women who are regular customers.

There is no evidence provided by the objector that my shop causes 'the drunks' to gather in the Triangle. It is well-documented that the steps implemented during the Triangle's renovation are the actual cause of this congregation. I am actively collaborating with other traders who are striving to improve this area.

Moreover, there have been no reports of 'drunks' harassing people at bus stops, whether in a sexual or non-sexual manner.

I met with the objector at the license hearing for Wiggle and understand that, since the onset of COVID-19, she has been on a personal mission to close down all sex shops and sexual entertainment venues.

I respect and welcome the objector's democratic right to voice her concerns, but it is important to consider the significant cost to taxpayers, especially during times of financial strain for local authorities. It is evident from the objections to various SEVs and sex shops that the objector is often copying and pasting information from the internet. Many points in these objections are either untrue or lack supporting evidence.

I invited the Objector to the shop to see what she is objecting against, but she has refused.

How much longer can a keyboard warrior go on costing the council money?

On a more personal note, I have observed how a single objector can impact my staff, who thoroughly enjoy their work at Easy Tiger. Although the objector's disapproval and arguments against the shop appear muddled and confused, it nonetheless causes my staff to worry about the security of their jobs.

As humans, sexual intimacy is a natural part of our lives, and some individuals require assistance to achieve it. Providing a safe, welcoming, and friendly environment where they can purchase such items is essential. Healthy and fulfilling sexual relationships are crucial for our well-being and continuity as a species.

I understand and appreciate that some people choose not to be sexually active or have no desire for sexual activity. Like the objector, these individuals can simply choose not to enter a sex shop.

The support demonstrated and attached to this letter highlights the need for my store. I would appreciate it if you could take the time to visit the shop and read through the letters of support. These letters include endorsements from professional bodies as well as thoughtful messages from my customers.

My business supports several employees and contributes to a pension fund. I diligently pay all taxes, including VAT, PAYE, and Corporation Tax. Without this business, my contributions would be significantly reduced.

As you are aware, I pay an annual license fee that is significantly higher than those in other local authorities. If the shop were to close, this license fee revenue would be lost.

Thank you for considering our application. I am available at your earliest convenience for any further information or documentation you may require. I look forward to a favourable review and the opportunity to demonstrate our commitment to operating a reputable and responsible establishment.

RE: Your letter of Objection to the licence at the above premises and Mediation

Thank you for your thought out and detailed objection regarding the licensing of Easy Tiger as a sex establishment. I appreciate the time and effort you have taken to articulate your concerns and the potential impact on the community, particularly children and other vulnerable groups.

Your reference to the former Sex Establishment Licensing policy and the High Court's decision provides a valuable context for understanding what constitutes reasonable restrictions on the location of such establishments in Bournemouth. The location of sex establishments are set out in the policy of the council which I have no control over. You could kindly ask them when the next consultation period will be and you will be able to raise your views and objections to sex shops including the location.

On granting the licence at 27 The Triangle (and previously at 8 The Triangle) the Council stipulated in the licence conditions that the store should be a mainly a LGBT+ lifestyle adult store. As such I stock much more than what you probably think is in a sex establishment, for example what you call 'the microphone' were Theragun massagers which are also sold in John Lewis. Also food supplements and protein shakes which are advertised on rotating A-boards which are also found in the likes of Holland and Barrett.

Yes we do sell sex toys but most are found in other shops on the High Street and even supermarkets have sex toy sections. The question about harm to the public must be raised against the likes of Tesco and Boots for selling sex toys for children who are more exposed to supermarkets than an over-18's shop like mine. To see a sex toy in my store you have to go into the shop where ID is required. In the likes of Tesco kids are left freely to wander the aisles including the sex toy section.

GP's and the NHS send people into the store for safe sex items along with the health products we sell.

I acknowledge your points regarding the visibility of the shop's interior from the outside, the discrepancies in the licence application, and the advertised items that are not listed on the application form. A full list of items would require reams of paper and thus these are classed as adult novelties, they have been for the past 20+ years with no objection but if you would like a complete list of items included I am more than happy to send them to you for your inspection? The reason for window displays is because we sell much more than sex items, the local authority didn't want a blacked out seedy shop and nor do my customers.

Restricting items in Easy Tiger that are also sold freely and without a licence by other shops on the high street would advantage other businesses and allow them to dominate the market. This is a breach of the Competitions Act and my human right to earn an honest living. This was highlighted to Wiltshire County Council in 2017 by the District Judge at Swindon County Court during a window display appeal.

We hardly sell any R18 DVDs and our shop space for 'adult toys and novelties' is less than Ann Summers. In the next 18 months to 2 years DVD sales will be zero thus negating the need for the licence and the annual renewal including the annual fees paid to the local authority. Until this point I will adhere to the licence and conditions as I have in the since 2004.

Your concerns about the basement storage being used. Bournemouth Borough Council Planning visited and inspected the Premises nearly 17 years ago and as Wilts and Dorset had been trading for over 30 years from the premises the 10 year rule applied and no planning or change of use

was needed. Thank you for your indepth research and bringing this to my attention. Rest assured I will look into why the records have not changed.

Your perspective on the Public Sector Equality Duty and the need to balance the impact on all groups, especially pregnant women, breastfeeding mothers, and children, is important. The lived experiences you have shared highlight the practical challenges and discomforts that may arise for the minority of the community. Most people have and enjoy sex. Some may need help from sexual aids or specific lubricants for assistance to succeed in happy and lengthy relationships, including making babies.

You didn't highlight the same objection for men or those of intersex. As a business we strive to be inclusive to all.

I feel you may have overlooked that the demographic of customers that come into my store which are approximately 50% adult females, Children under the age of 18 are not permitted and anyone looking under the age of 25 is challenged for ID.

Moreover, I recognise the effort and public investment aimed at revitalising Bournemouth Triangle. Ensuring that the area remains welcoming and family-friendly is crucial for its ongoing regeneration and success. When I moved into 27 The Triangle I set up the Triangle Traders association. My shop was one of twelve occupied units. By working together we managed to get the Triangle developed into what it is today. Although not perfect it is much better than the empty bus shelters that blighted the area 17 years ago. It has also encouraged more businesses into the area and we as a collective trading community are proud that the Triangle hasn't trended like the town centres of Poole and Bournemouth which are blighted with empty shop units.

I, along with Barry Alborough founded Bourne Free Pride which for years drove footfall into the town especially the Triangle. I do care about the Triangle and that is why I recently campaigned to get the rat infested planters changed outside the library and the public rubbish bins emptied regularly.

My business voluntarily joined and contributed to the Bournemouth BID this year. I also subscribe to the 'town centre link' sharing information on crime in the Triangle, and when requested support the Police with CCTV for the Triangle making it a safer and more welcoming place.

I recognise and fully appreciate your point regarding the harassment of drunk people in the Triangle. We all have had enough of this. This can only be stopped with the restriction of alcohol sales in the small off licences that blight the area and do not care who they sell alcohol to.

None of the people I have spoken to today in this area including a library worker have ever heard of any complaint of drunk people referencing my licensed premises in association with women or men.

There are very few buses that stop in the Triangle compared to many years ago. I completely understand you having to pass the Triangle to get your bus as I would travelling to and from Poole, the buses in the Triangle don't go to the same destinations as the Poole Hills bus stop.

Customers coming into my store travel from far and wide to visit the store and this town. They are from a wide demographic of people including councillors and your fellow peers at the [REDACTED]. Although the store is not for you it is essential for some and those wanting long and loving relationships.

Thank you once again for your input. I have thoroughly reviewed all aspects of your objection. Although the majority should be directed at a BCP policy review I have taken on board your points.

It was a pleasure to finally meet you face to face today and have a discussion prior to the hearing of Wiggle.

In response to your concerns in your email:

- Many of our products are FDA approved and go through more stringent processes than they would in the UK. This includes Lubricants.
- The staff always offer cleaners, sprays, foam and wipes with all purchases. We have a sign on the shop counter 'don't forget your toy cleaner'.
- Many products that you are concerned about these days are dishwasher safe negating the unfounded concern in your email about cleanliness.
- The majority of my customers are happy couples or solo customers who wanted individual adult novelties for sole use.
- I work very closely with Sexual Health Dorset and do not sell barrier methods you are mentioning as the sexual health industry has not produced an 100% effective solution to barrier lubricants. I do sell packs of CE certified condoms and give away free individual condoms.

- Your concern about my license and Herpes screening should be directed to Sexual Health Dorset. Thoroughly researching the Herpes virus it is not solely a sexual virus and to stigmatise Herpes in this way would have a negative effect on the detection and prevention of the virus. Herpes can be passed from person to person simply by touch. Herpes-zoster or Chicken Pox, part of the herpes virus family, is passed on in very young children which can cause shingles later on in life.
- I would not consider offering stop smoking products as I personally think these have the opposite effect and in some cases encourage smoking of vapes and the uptake of smoking real cigarettes including smoking addiction.
- Regarding Google street view. This is from 2002. Google automatically blurs out faces and also makes mistakes as you can also see it blurs out union flags, phones from the shop window next door etc. This window was the Jubilee window for which the shop won the Bournemouth Chamber of Commerce award for the best window display in the town.
- Yes there is adequate screening in the window display.
- The bus stop seating was removed in the Triangle in 2010 and a wall was built for people to sit on. The bus to and from Poole has not operated in the Triangle since 2009.
- You may have not seen sex toys displayed if you don't go to town centres. I have attached images of the shops in the high street displaying sex toys including Theragun at John Lewis. My local pharmacy has clitoral stimulators advertised in the window next to signs selling Viagra. Nearly all toilets have vending machines for sex toys that will be seen by those of all ages.
- We do not sell pornographic material on our website so a pop up message was required but I will contact the people who run our website and get installed the 'are you 18 or over' button. Looking at other sites online I will probably be the first to do this. Your point is noted and will be acted on.

My main concern is not for my license but for the taxpayers' money in the crusade against Sexual Entertainment Venues. It is costing the council a fortune and the time haemorrhaged by those working for BCP Council. The time and money could be used in tackling your main concern - anti-social behaviour.




