Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

Mandatory Conditions (Sections 19,20,21 LA 2003)

- 1.1. There shall be no sale or supply of alcohol when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this premises licence or at a time when the said premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or when his/her licence is suspended.
- 1.2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 1.3. Any person used to carry out a security activity as required under condition 2.5 below must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- 1.4. Admission of children (under the age of 18) to any exhibition of films must be restricted in accordance with the film classification body designated as the authority under Section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984.
- 1.5. Where the film classification is not specified, or the relevant licensing authority has notified the premises licence holder under Section 20 (3)(b) of the Licensing Act 2003, the admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the Licensing Authority.

The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) (Amendment) Order 2014

- 1.6.
 1. The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 2. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises –
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti- social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 1.7. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

1.8.

1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
2. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

1.9. The responsible person must ensure that -

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Conditions) Order 2014

1.10.

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 -
 - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula —

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where –

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

- (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- 2.1 CCTV shall be installed and thereafter maintained in good working order, covering all public parts of the premises excluding the lavatories and the area immediately outside the front of the premises.
- 2.1.1 Recordings should be maintained for a minimum period of 30 days and shall be accurately date and time stamped. The system shall be checked at least once a week and a written record of the checks will be kept.
- 2.1.2 Facilities should be made available to allow police and other authorised officers to view recordings on request and to be provided with copies in a readable format as soon as is reasonably practicable, provided that any request to view or for a copy is compliant with data protection regulations.
- 2.2 Customers will be prohibited from entering and leaving the premises with open containers, including bottles.
- 2.3 The premises shall adopt at Challenge 25 policy whereby any person who appears to be under the age of 25 shall be required to produce photographic proof of age in one or other of the forms specified by the mandatory conditions.
- 2.4 No glass pint or half pint drinking vessels (other than toughened glass) nor glass bottles shall be served to customers anywhere within the premises after 22:00 hours on Friday and Saturday nights and all pint or half pint drinking vessels and glass bottles in the public areas of the premises (other than toughened glass drinking vessels and wine bottles) should be cleared by 22:30 on those nights. For the avoidance of doubt, after 22:00 hours on Friday and Saturday

night, all drinks normally served in a glass bottle (other than wine) shall be decanted into non-glass or toughened glass drinking vessels.

- 2.5 A risk assessment shall be undertaken to determine the number of door staff to be deployed at the premises from 21.00 hours until the premises close, on each Friday and Saturday night and on New Year's Eve.
- 2.5.1 The risk assessment shall include an assessment of the nature of any event taking place at the premises and the likely number of attendees.
- 2.5.2 In the absence of a written risk assessment which indicates that it would be appropriate to deploy only one door supervisor (or no door supervisor at all), a minimum of two door supervisors will be deployed at those times.
- 2.5.3 Copies of written risk assessments will be retained for a period of at least 6 months and made available for inspection by authorised officers on request.
- 2.6 The premises shall maintain an incident book and refusals register and shall use the same to record any incident involving the suspected commission of a criminal offence or antisocial behaviour within the premises and any occasion upon which a person is refused service of alcohol or is asked to leave the premises (other than a closing time).
- 2.6.1 The incident book and refusals register should be made available for inspection by police and other authorised officers on request and should be retained for a period of at least 12 months.
- 2.7 The showing of films in the basement area as regulated entertainment shall cease no later than Midnight each day.
- 2.8 The premises shall be an active member of any Town Watch or Pub Watch scheme that may be in operation and from time to time participate in any initiatives agreed by the scheme.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

- 2.9 The premises shall display signage within the bar areas (but not the restaurant) informing customers that unruly behaviour shall not be tolerated. Signage shall also be prominently displayed at all exits from the premises asking that customers leave quietly and respect the neighbours.

Protection of Children form Harm

- 2.10 No child under the age of 18 shall be permitted to enter or remain in the premises after 22.30 hours.
- 2.11 No nudity or semi-nudity permitted.


