Please describe briefly the nature of the proposed variation (Please see guidance note 2)

This is an established premises offering a unique variety of activities including late-night entertainment and daytime dance classes in Bournemouth Town Centre. This premises is owned and operated by Lascelles Richardson who has vast experience of delivering safe, vibrant and diverse venues throughout the area. This is a popular venue, recently refurbished, with further aspirations to become the leading destination for adults to enjoy dancing, music and other cultural activities.

Consumer habits have evolved significantly in recent years. There is an increasing demand for experience-led venues offering quality entertainment, premium refreshment, alcohol-free alternatives and diverse cultural events, rather than venues focused solely on alcohol consumption. Many customers, particularly younger adults and international visitors, are drinking less, arriving later and seeking greater variety and enrichment during a night out.

These changing trends have become even more apparent following the recent closure of established late-night venues in Bournemouth, resulting in fewer high-quality venues capable of meeting current demand, particularly at weekends. This application seeks to provide a well-managed, premium venue that contributes positively to Bournemouth's evening economy while helping retain visitors and expenditure within the town.

The popularity of this venue and feedback received from the customers has led to this application being submitted. We have carefully considered the wider impact of these enhancements on the local community and our commitment to promoting the licensing objectives and we are confident that an enhancement of our existing conditions will ensure that we continue to promote the licensing objectives beyond the grant of this variation.

The below is a summary of the proposed variation -

1. Extend the permitted hours for licensable activities from 03:00 until 05:00 hours on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays preceding a Bank Holiday Monday.
2. Incorporate the use of the upper (second) floor of the building into the licensed premises
3. Update the existing conditions to further promote the licensing objectives.

We are grateful for the advice of both the BCP Environmental Health Department and Dorset & Wiltshire Fire & Rescue in advance of this application. The guidance and direction offered has been fully incorporated into this application.

We have successfully delivered extended licensable activities within the existing footprint through Temporary Event Notices, which has further informed the enhancements proposed to the existing schedule of conditions.

The operator is committed to promoting and upholding the four licensing objectives and in support of this variation application, has reviewed the existing operating procedures.

Operational procedures relating to staff training and incident management have been further strengthened. The policies and management controls set out below are examples of the measures that will be implemented and applied in the operation of the premises following the grant of the proposed variation:

- Conflict Management
- Crime Scene Preservation
- Vulnerability Policy
- Found Weapons Policy
- Drug Policy

The applicant is committed to operating the premises in accordance with these policies and to adopting best practice in order to ensure the ongoing promotion of the licensing objectives. These policies and procedures will be reviewed and updated on a regular basis, with any additional measures or amendments being incorporated where appropriate, including in response to advice or recommendations from Dorset Police or any other Responsible Authority.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

a. The applicant proposes to replace the existing condition 2.2 with the following -

The Premises Licence Holder shall undertake a written risk assessment regarding the deployment of SIA Door Supervisors at different times of the day, on different days of the week and for different types of events to determine the appropriate number of SIA Door Supervisors required. The premises shall operate in accordance with the findings of that risk assessment.

b. The applicant proposes to introduce the following condition -

A minimum of two SIA Door Supervisors shall wear and actively utilise Body Worn Video whenever SIA staff are deployed and at least one shall be allocated to the SIA Door Supervisor positioned at the main entrance of the venue.

Body Worn Video footage will be available for 28 days upon any reasonable and lawful request from Dorset Police or other Authorised Person.

c. The applicant proposes the replacement of condition 2.2.4 with the following -

On Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays preceding a Bank Holiday Monday, a minimum of two SIA Door Supervisors shall be on duty from 22:00 hours until 30 minutes after the final customer has left the premises or until all customers have dispersed from the immediate vicinity of the premises.

c) Public safety

a. The applicant proposes to replace existing condition 2.7 with the following to provide enhanced operational clarity and consistency -

The licence holder shall adopt a comprehensive Search Policy at all times that licensable activities are offered at the premises. This Search Policy must be available for inspection by Dorset Police and other Authorised Persons at all times that licensable are taking place or upon reasonable request outside of these times.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

e) The protection of children from harm

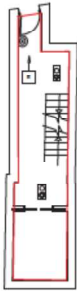
This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

1. You do not have to pay a fee if the only purpose of the variation for which you are applying is to avoid becoming liable for the late night levy

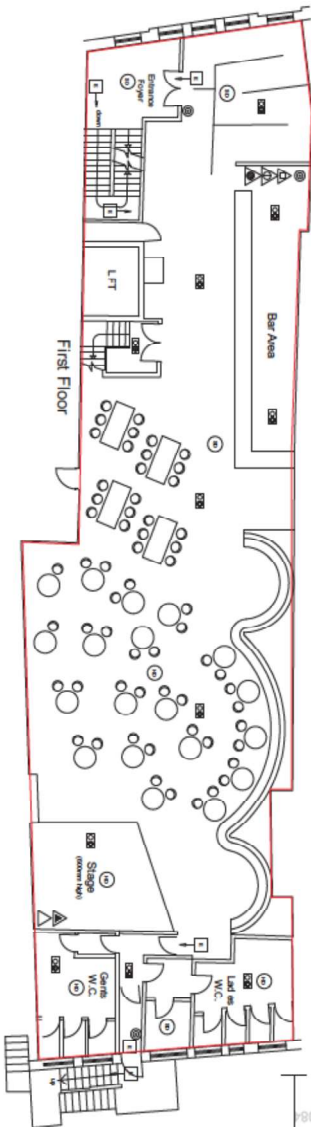

- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.

- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

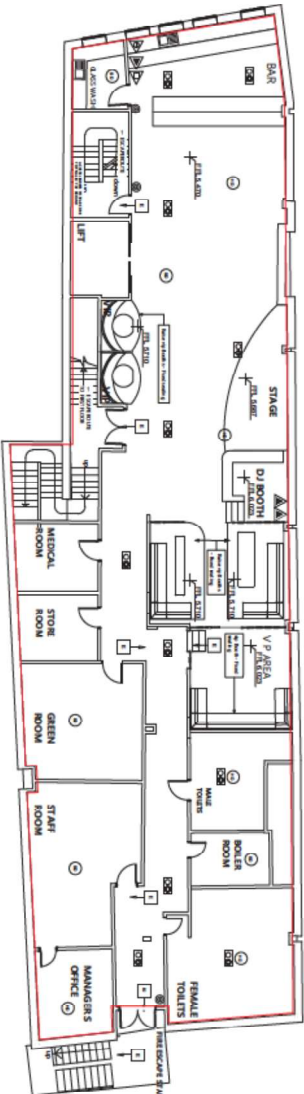
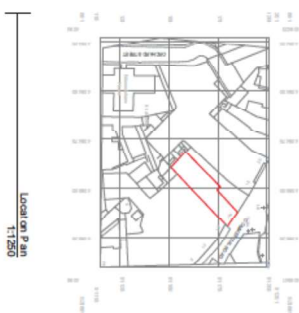

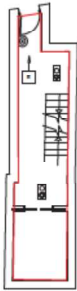
PREMISES LICEENCE - GROUND FLOOR

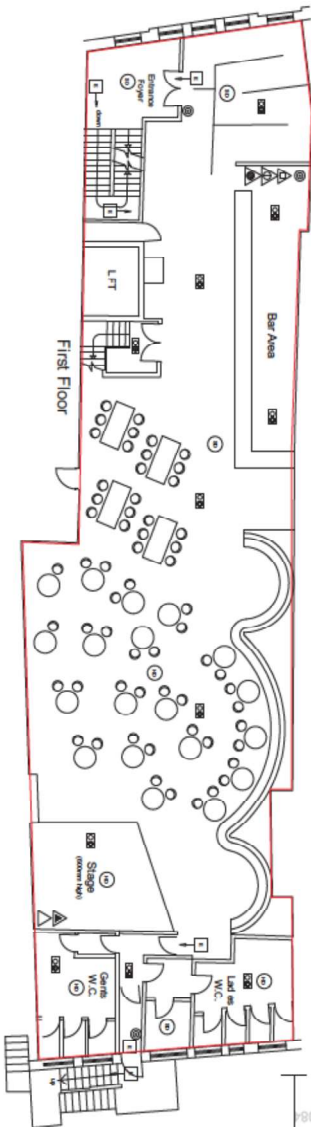
DRAFT PREMISES LICENCE - FIRST FLOOR

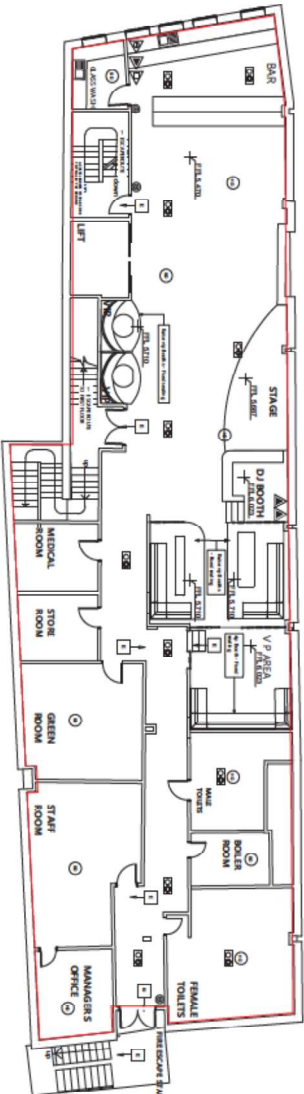
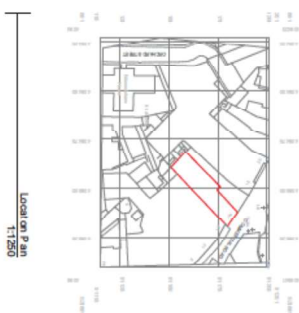
